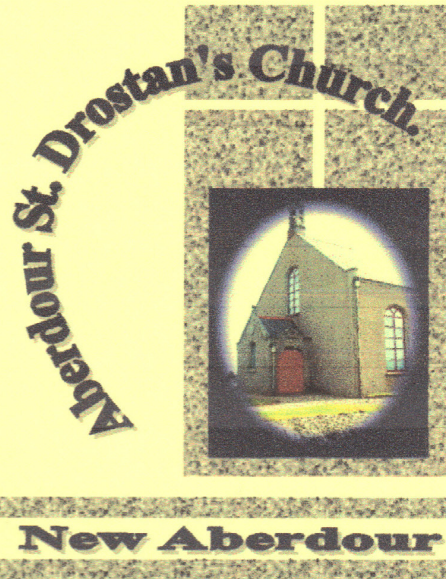
Once more Easter celebrations will soon be with us.
