Matthew 7;24 –27 So then, anyone who hears these words of mine and obeys them is like a wise man who built his house on rock. The rain poured down, the rivers flooded over, and the wind blew hard against that house. But it did not fall because it was built on rock

I am sure we all remember the parable mentioned in Matthew's gospel we have known it since were children, probably because we loved the actions used in the song "the rain came down and the floods came up". But there is a serious side to the parable,

What most people do not realize is that flood damage is done long before we see a house collapse or a car float downstream. The damage starts as the water pressure rises enough to move the smallest grains of sand, which means that the larger bits then have no support and so they fall because their own weight works against them. But it did not fall because it was built on rock.

That is the lesson we need to keep in our minds in the next months, The church is precious yes, but the church only becomes alive when you are in it,

What we have to believe is that the God who inspired those who have gone before us to pray and work for a Church is the same God. Today, Yesterday and Tomorrow

How we manage these changes will decide what Church our children and grandchildren have to worship in.
