Matthew 9;37—38 The harvest is large, but there are few workers to gather it in. Pray to the owner of the harvest, He will send out workers.

The central thesis of the Christian Gospel is that Jesus Christ is coming back to this Earth and you know when He does He is not coming back for bags of apples or potatoes, or bunches of flowers, tomatoes, important as these things are, but a harvest of people.


One of the great strengths of our Faith is that we are all different, we have different strengths weaknesses, we are not expected to produce the same, but we are expected to produce what we can.
