PROGRAMME FOR OPENING OF NEW SCHOOL, 1968 The new school at Eberdour contains a general purpose room, three classrooms, and a youth service area which is also available for medical inspection purposes.

It has been designed to give in ximum use of the space available. The general purpose-cum-dining room was been placed between two class-rooms and is separated from them by folding partitions. This whole area can, therefore, be used as one room when the need arises.

Timber and brick are used extensively in the construction of this school. All external walls are of brick with large timber windows and the general purpose room and classrooms have laminated timber posts and beams supporting a ceiling of timber decking. The windows are all double glazed and the school is heated by underfloor electric coils.

A football pitch has been laid out on a site adjacent to the school and the site of the old school has been used to provide a new playground area.

The total cost of the project was £44,300.

The new school was planned and the work carried out under the supervision of Mr. John C. Arnott, A.R.I.B.A., F.R.I.A.S., County Architect.
